From the Senior Pastor



Dear Friends In Christ,

This past Sunday, in my message, I said: "If Redeemer church looks to the Lord with sure expectancy, our strength will be exchanged for His strength and we will be able to live in a way we have never lived before."

That is a loose paraphrase of Isaiah 40:31, applied to Redeemer Church. The passage says: "Yet those who wait for the LORD will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles, They will run and not get tired, They will walk and not become weary."

I chose this passage for the sermon text because I wanted to make the point that, as a church, we need to wait to hear from the Lord for our direction for the summer months. And in

order to hear from the Lord, we need to be in contact with the Lord.

If we "wait on the Lord" – that is, if we "look to the Lord with sure expectancy," – we will be given strength which is beyond our human strength. We will be given that strength so that we can accomplish great things for the Head of the church, Jesus Christ.

What are you praying about in this season –

the beginning of summer? Please be praying for God's direction so that we can hear His voice and follow where He leads. And remain faithful this summer – faithful in your attendance at worship and faithful in the giving of your tithes and offerings. That way you will surely have a blessed summer.

with The Fruits of the Spirit in February and March. In April and May we learned our battle tactics by learning about The Armor of God.

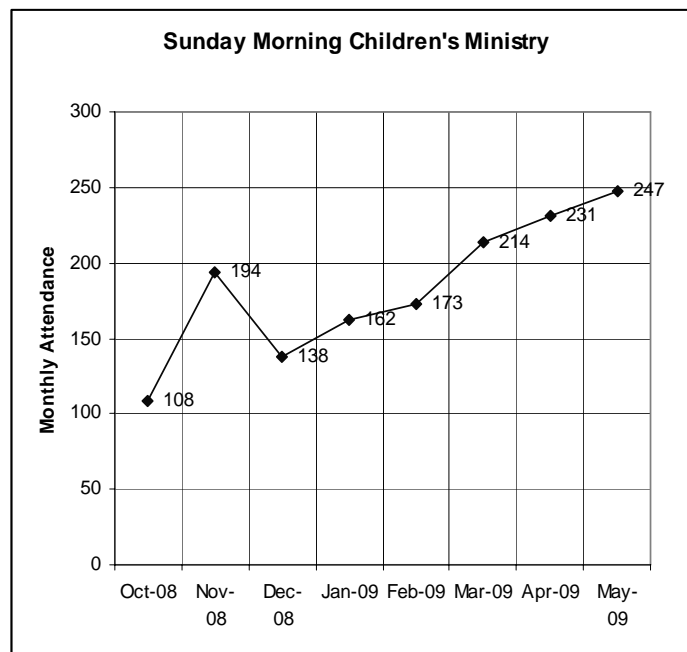
Our youth went to two lock-ins outside the church, and had two lock-ins at the church. We've done outreach that really caught the kid's attention with a desire to keep it going. In Columbus we went door to door asking for food donations and if we could pray for people. When it was time to regroup, the kids wanted to keep going and opted to skimp on dinner time in order to talk to more folks. Locally we spent a couple hours at the local children's home, helping remodel in hopes of opening the home soon.

I can see where our kids have grown spiritually, but we can also look and see how

So what does the summer hold for our children and youth? Working around summer schedules can be tough as we found out recently at our youth meeting. We came up with four events for the summer, but only one date that a majority of the kids could attend. We will be heading to the Creation Museum July 13th; Solid Rock camp is also in July. Almost half of our Guatemala mission team is comprised of youth with four of our teens stepping out into world missions. August will be exciting with our annual Vacation Bible School and before you know it, we're back in the school year.

On the drawing board for fall 2009 will be the introduction of an Awana program that will involve all of our children and youth on Wednesday nights. Awana is a mid-week Bible club. **A Workman Approved is Not**

Ashamed taken from 2 Timothy 2:15 is where we get the name. In the Awana program the kids will gather in a large group for worship and teaching, have small groups where they memorize in their head scripture verses but also take them to heart by learning how to apply them. We also spend some time in fellowship, playing games. Our children will participate in the program and it is my goal that our youth get some hands on experience in sharing their faith by working with our children.



we've grown physically. Where the Spirit is at work, and God is being taught about, people are attracted. This is evident as we look at our attendance. We have grown over 200% in our Sunday morning children's ministry attendance since October with nearly 250 opportunities each month to tell our children and youth about the love of Christ. Wednesday nights have seen similar percentage increases as well.

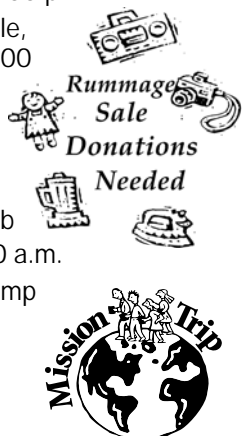

Baked Summer Veggies

- | | |
|-------------------------|---|
| 1 sweet onion | 1 zucchini squash, sliced |
| 1 bell pepper, chopped | 1 Roma Tomato, diced & drained (or can) |
| 3 carrots, sliced | 4 T. butter |
| 3 stalks celery, sliced | salt, pepper, garlic, basil & parsley, to taste |
| 1 yellow squash, sliced | bread crumbs or croutons |



Using a non-stick spray, coat the inside of a 1-1/2 quart pan. Layer veggies like lasagna. Drizzle each layer with olive oil & seasonings. Top with tomato. Sprinkle dish with bread crumb topping. Bake @ 350° until tender.

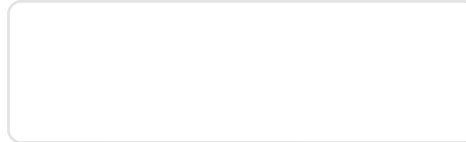

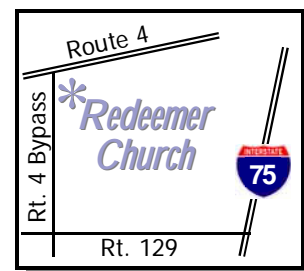
